### • PRESIDENTS ANNUAL REPORT FOR 2024/25

I would like to take this opportunity to thank members for their attendance at this AGM. I would also like to acknowledge and thank all of our sponsors for their contributions over the last year and we look forward to their continuing support over the years.

I also would like to thank the committee for their great work over the year. We have achieved a lot and the committee members have been very active with committee administration and as well as their hands on involvement with so many things about the Club and the course. Your support and dedication to the Club has enabled us to continue to build on the good work of the members and committees who went before us.

I would like to personally thank the club secretary Kerry Jones for her great work. She is extremely efficient and has used the G drive set up by Nigel and it houses all our key folders for future committee reference. Kerry is an outstanding secretary and we are lucky to have her.

Also, I'd like to thank Andrew. The finances are all in excellent order and he manages and reports effectively to the committee on a monthly basis. On top of his financial work, Andrew is an integral part of the course management work. He is enthusiastic about taking an active role in all the work around the course. We are also lucky to have him as he brings so much to the Golf Club.

Nigel has managed all that is required with the application and acquittal documents for the Regeneration Grant through the Gingin Shire. His expertise in this area has been invaluable.

Phil Flavell has been an excellent Captain, and I'd like to thank him for all the work he does throughout the year. He takes a bigger role than that of specifically the Club Captain. Kevin Malone (as Wed Captain) and Bob Johnson (as Vice-Captain) also do a power of work in these roles but also do a lot of ongoing work around the course. Along with Ron Jones, the course is very well managed and



maintained due to their collective ongoing efforts. The vital aspect of the retic is expertly maintained by Richard Prince. His commitment, expertise and work ethic is invaluable as are his trouble shooting and development expertise. Thank you very much Richard. Thanks Abe and Emmie for all the great work you do in enhancing and improving the course and the golf club.

This year, we have had an ongoing group of mainly committee members who meet usually on the first week of each month to tick along course work. Our course worker, Joel Collins has learnt a lot and he has taken so much pressure off the volunteers and committee. He has taken direction from the Grounds Coordinators and has the course looking so good. Thanks for your efforts, Joel.

Congratulations to all the winners over the winter season.

A big thanks to our sponsors and our members for their generous donations of prizes for the winners during the Saturday winter golf competitions. Congratulations to this years' Championship winners in Phil Flavell and Lynn Malone. Our Open Day was a huge success thanks to the support of Abe and Emmie Wright. We attracted many players from elsewhere and it was a great day.

It has been very noticeable that we have had a larger than usual number of our members visiting other local courses and attending Open Days, be it near and far. In many cases, Guilderton golfers have been in the winners lists and our Club has gained a much bigger and positive profile, again near and far.

Some of the key features and decisions that we have made over the course of the year have been:

- Easter Fundraiser success in the raising of approx. \$4000. The Committee will have to decide if we can sustain it as a major fundraiser given it is at a time when a number of the committee are away and volunteers are hard to find.
- Formalize a Regeneration Plan which has mapped our current and future planting. We have made changes and now included a summer watering program to increase the chances of success of the planting program. Similarly, it is now documented where cutting, mowing and slashing is permitted. We are ever conscious of our obligations regarding the golf course as a reserve.
- We have also formalized the Golf Cart Storage Shed use and conditions so that in moving forward there is a process and expectation with regard to the use of the storage shed.
- Mi Golf thanks Andrew is working well.
- Bob continues to tick along with the extension of the Golf Cart Storage shed and it will be completed in a matter of weeks.

### Going forward and our challenges:

Decisions regarding grass greens. From my personal point of view, I think grass greens will only add to the attraction of our course for residents, members, visitors etc. and consequently provide the chance to increase our income. However, the dream of grass greens needs to be considered alongside our financial capacity, work/volunteer manpower and a possible increase in paid work hours.

Volunteer workers: the volunteer workers group has developed over the course of this year and has been very successful. Their success can only be sustained if we don't burn out the group both physically and mentally. Adding expertise and numbers to this group, no matter how small in number, is vital for the sustained excellent management of the course.



To conclude, I hope we can attract more members and enlist more volunteers for the little and big jobs over the course of the year. Committees and Clubs work most effectively and sustain success and growth if the load is shared.

We had our first year of the Scroungers Cup which is a 3 day competition of 9 holes between Lancelin, Ledge Point and Guilderton played in November at each club on consecutive days. We were lucky enough to win it the first year and hopefully will bring the trophy back again next week when the competition is scheduled. The more players we have the better chance we have of winning. Overall a good year with reasonable numbers, slightly lower in the winter months when people head for the warmer weather. If you are looking for an enjoyable Wednesday afternoon, come along and have a shot at Wednesday Afternoon Scroungers, we tee off at 2pm with a 1.45 pm registration.

### • COURSE COORDINATORS REPORT

### **BOB JOHNSON**

It is always a good exercise to reflect on the year gone by and it is with some surprise that I realise it just a year since Joel Collins bravely put his hand up for the challenges of course management. Training over the year has allowed Joel to take more and more control of the weekly maintenance reducing the load on our many volunteers. A big thank you to Joel and all the volunteers including Ron Jones, Kevin Malone, Andrew McKean, Ian Hastings, Wayne Bennett, Mike Cope who have together put in nearly 500 hours work over the year.

We have continued with the Revegetation programme sponsored by the Shire of Gingin grant. In the first year, several plants started to struggle through the dry summer months and were rescued by



Presidential hand watering. This year, we are grateful for the use of the Lower Moore River Working Group's watering trailer to extend the watering around the course.

Talking of watering, a big thank you to Ron Jones who has almost single handedly installed a new bore pump and motor to replace the burnt-out unit on the east side of number three green. We will now have two bores with individual overload protection units and updated electrical boards. And so on to reticulation, a big thank you to Richard Prince for continuing to both maintain and upgrade the sprinklers each year. In the last couple of months this has involved replacing some 50 or more aging sprinklers with new ones. This work has allowed fuller fairway coverage and reduced the number of dry sandy areas.

Consideration is still being given to convert the course from sand to grass greens but the subcommittee is still to work through the many pros and cons.

Back in 2008, the committee decided to name each of the fairways and the late Geoff Robson donated yellow aluminium signs for each of the Tee box sponsorship boards. Unfortunately, these have been 'stolen' from firstly Blue Wren Rise on 4, then River View on 7 and most recently Tuart Hollow on 3. Sad to see these disappear, but the names will be included on the replacement Tee Signs with the aerial photos and distances.
